

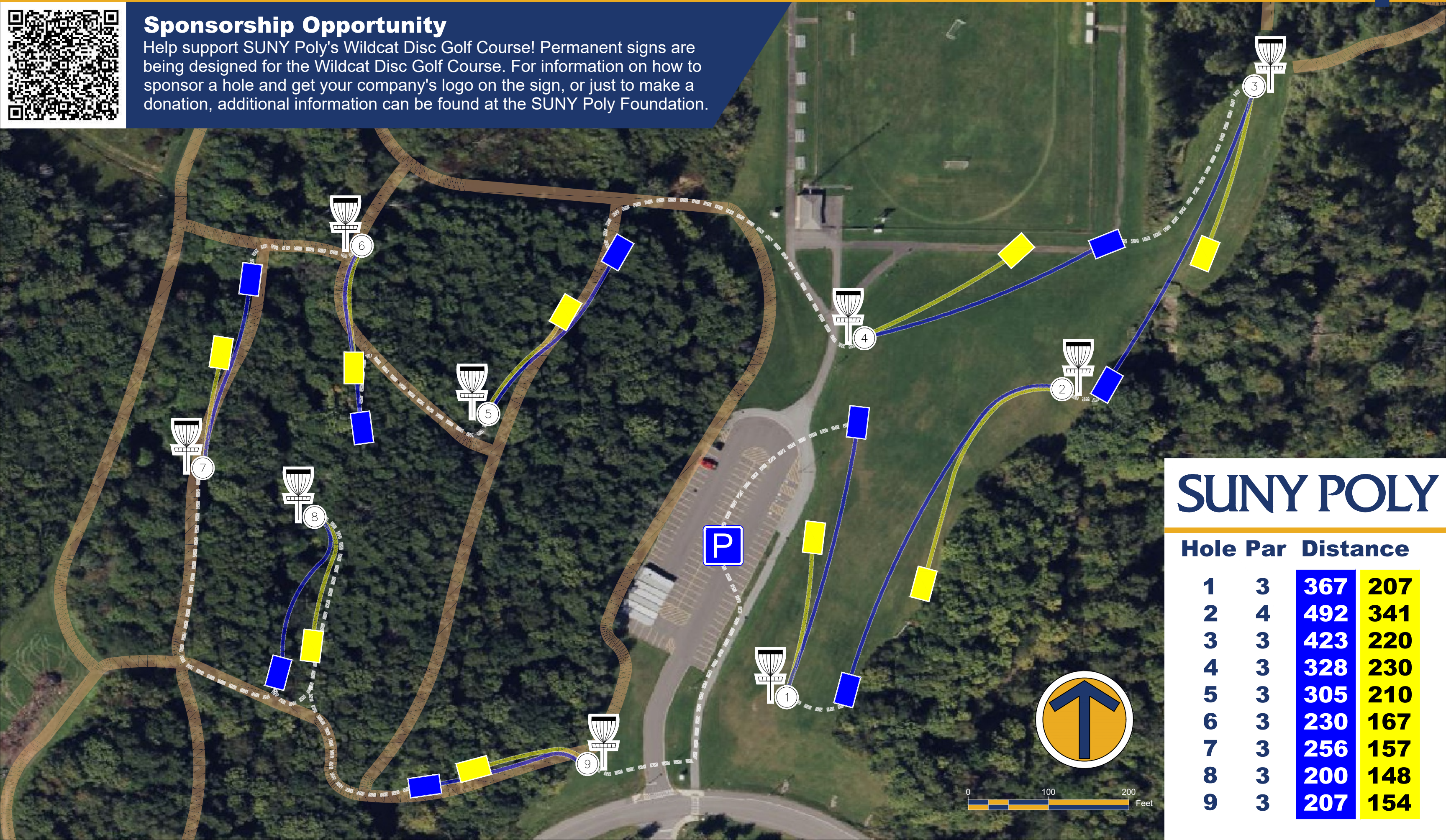

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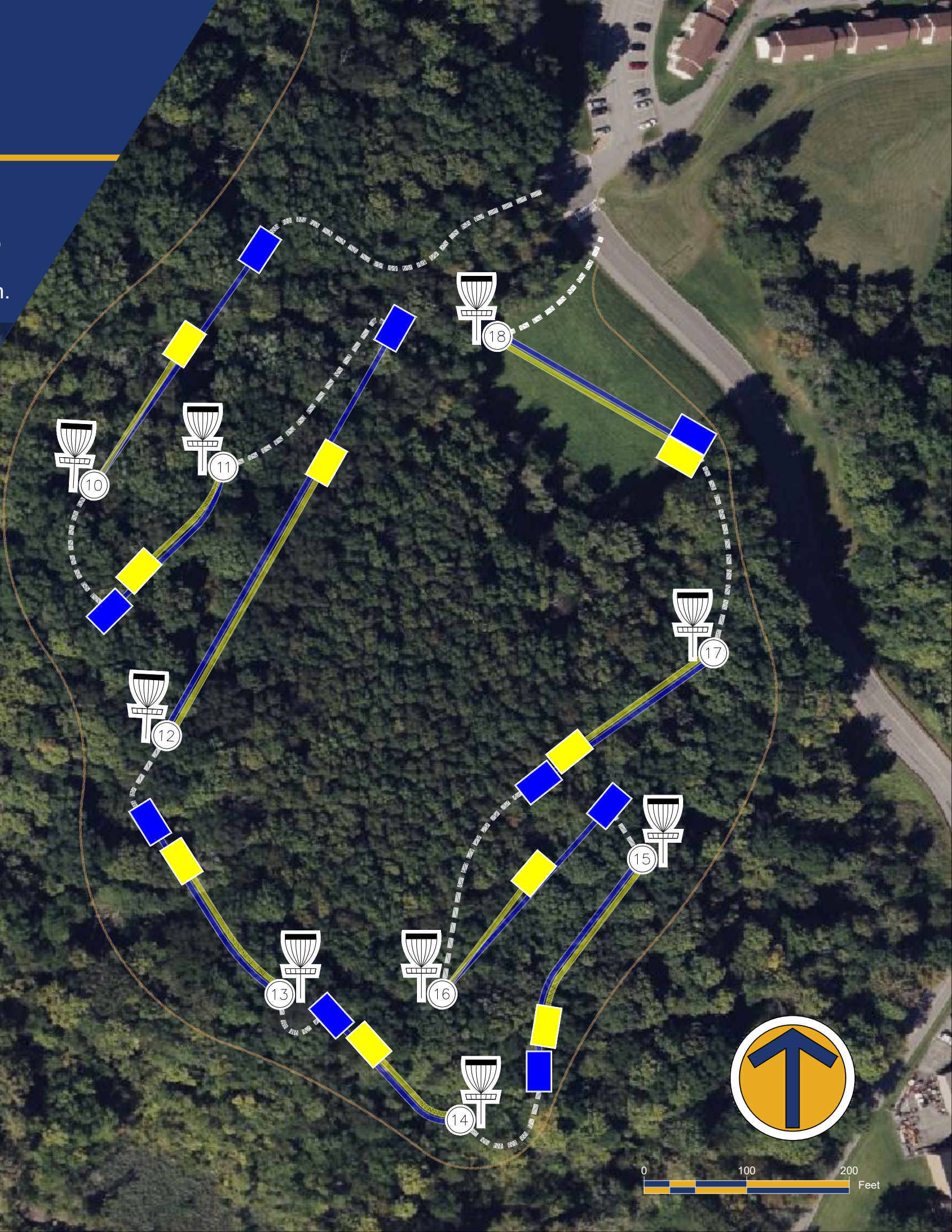

Wildcat Disc Golf Rules



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Safety

- **Safety first!** Throw only when the fairway and landing zone are completely clear of players, pedestrians, vehicles, and campus visitors.
- Respect trees, plants, wildlife, course equipment, and all campus property.
- Keep the course clean—pack out trash or use proper receptacles.

Basic Rules of Play

1. **Start at the tee:** Your first throw must be released from inside the teeing area with a supporting point touching the teeing surface.
2. **Throw from your lie:** After each throw, play from the spot where your disc comes to rest. Your lie is a small area directly behind the disc or behind a mini marker.
3. **Complete the hole:** The hole is finished when your disc comes to rest supported by the basket's chains or tray. A disc on top of the basket does not count.

Order of play:

- The player farthest from the target throws next.
- On the tee, the player with the best score on the previous hole throws first.

Legal stance: When you release the disc, a supporting point must be on the lie (or teeing area). Nothing may touch in front of the lie.

Putting rules (within 10 meters of the basket):

No jumping, stepping, or falling forward. You must show balance behind your lie before moving toward the basket.

Other Considerations

Count every throw: Your score is the sum of all throws plus any penalties.

Play the course as it is: You may not move or alter obstacles (e.g., break branches off of trees).

Casual obstacles: Small, loose items on the ground (e.g., pinecones, small rocks, twigs) may be moved. Feel free to help with course maintenance.

Dangerous obstacles: If your disc lands near something dangerous (e.g., stinging insects), you may move your lie backward along the line of play.

Relief options: If your disc is stuck in or under an obstacle and you cannot take a legal stance, mark a new lie directly behind it on the line of play.

Lost Discs: Your group has three minutes to search before a penalty is applied for a lost disc. If lost, play from your previous lie (or drop zone) with a penalty. If another's lost disc is found, please return it to its owner.
